She then served on the mission field in Mexico and Guatemala. Mrs. Robertson was a member of Chelten - A Church of Hope, formerly known as Chelten Baptist Church. In addition to her husband, she is survived by two sons; Wyatt Robertson and his wife Amy of Perkasie, PA: and Mark Robertson and his wife Teresa of Sellersville, PA; a daughter, Karen Griffin and her husband Cliff of treasure Island, FL, five grandchildren; Caden, Cassidy, Nathan, Emily, and Anna, and four sisters; Gwen Wiedman of East Stroudsburg, Carol Taylor of East Stroudsburg, Susan Rosseli or Horsham, and Doris McDade of North Wales; and a brother, Harry G. I'm sorry to say that we've lost two Classmates since our last column:

George Butvilas and Ray Clatworthy.

Barbara Butvilas notified Tom Leiser that George had passed away suddenly on 21 December 2021 at his daughter's home in Marietta, GA. George and Barbara were married in the Chapel on 8 June 1967. Afterwards, he served two Vietnam tours and rose to the rank of LCDR in the Reserves. He began a very successful career in banking and teaching in 1971. He began banking at American National Bank, achieving increasingly senior positions in the industry in Michigan. In 1987 he completed the Harvard Business School Advanced Management Program. He was an adjunct professor at Michigan Technical University's Business School and was inducted into the Honor Academies of both the Forestry Department and the Business Department there. He was made Honorary Alumnus of the year at MTU in 2007. In 1991 he was appointed by President Bush as the Chairman of the National Veterans Development

Corporation. He is survived by Barbara, his wife of 54 years, his three children: Christiann (Tom) Rosemurgy, Mike (Marcia) Butvilas, and Joellen (Mike) Razzano and numerous grandchildren. A Mass of Christian Burial for George was held on 29 December 2021 at St. Ignatius Loyola Church of Houghton, MI.

Dave Church was informed by Susan Goebel that **Ray Clatworthy** had died. **Jim Goebel** and Ray were roommates, and they married sisters: Judy and Susan.

Ray passed away on 19 December 2021 surrounded by his family. Ray was born in St. Louis in 1944 and was raised in Milwaukee. After graduation from Navy, Ray was commissioned in the Marine Corps and flew F-4 Phantoms. After leaving the Corps, he became a prolific entrepreneur who opened five restaurants, developed real estate, owned two Christian radio stations, and created a credit card that benefited Food for the Hungry. He raised his family in Dover, DE where he actively served his community through his church and several community boards. His faith in Christ was the center of his life, and as such one of his favorite ways to serve was teaching the Bible in church and in prisons with Prison Fellowship, sharing a weekly message of hope for over a decade. He ran for United States Senate in Delaware twice. He treasured family gatherings at their cottage on the Sassafras River off the Chesapeake Bay. He is survived by his wife of 54 years, Judy; his sons John (Stephanie) Clatworthy and Michael (Meredith) Clatworthy, his daughter Molly (Wes) Shepherd, and seven grandchildren. Ray's memorial service was held 28 December 2021 at West End Assembly of God, Richmond, VA. Memorial contributions may be made to Prison Fellowship at 1 (800) 206-9764, or the Jackson

Dave received a short note from **Chris Daniels** just after New Years that his dysautonomia symptoms had returned. He had been on medication that had helped, but he said:

■ ...The meds have worn off. I recognized it coming in September and have been out of action pretty much in bed since October. I thought it would be re-fixed by now so very frustrating...just hoping they do come up with something soon. Sharon is being the consummate nurse again taking care of me. I plan to (be) well for the 55th!

Just before Christmas, George Samaras was flying to Pensacola to meet Bob McFarland and John Fears to go to Bob's beach house in Alabama when he had a seizure and was taken off the plane. He was subsequently diagnosed with a brain tumor. His family had him transferred to Duke University Hospital where he underwent a seven hour surgery. He will have to undergo radiation and chemotherapy. Michael Cathey talked to him on 1 January 2022, and he had been transferred back home to San Antonio where he'll be treated. He'll travel back to North Carolina periodically for additional consultations.

Two Classmates, **Ted Lewis** and **Don McKee**, were affected by the Marshall Fire in Colorado around New Years. We could raise neither by phone (they were busy!) but from what we could piece together, Don and Barb in Louisville, CO appeared to be a couple of miles outside the fire's boundary while Ted and Sally in Superior, CO were right on the boundary or just inside it. Both were in the evacuation zone.

It turned out that Ted and Sally were in Florida so they were watching this play out from their hotel room. They did receive a message from a neighbor who had been able to walk in to their

cul-de-sac and found that all their homes were intact. They returned to Colorado the afternoon of 31 December, rented a car, and checked in to a hotel since they were not allowed back to their home. Ted said he walked for about a mile and a half to the house and found it undamaged except for smoke and soot, but the fire had come within 150 feet. They finally got to go home on 21 January, but of course, they have to deal with insurance and extensive cleanup.

Don and Barb, on the other hand, were at home when the evacuation order came. She said she was doing dishes, looking north at a blue sky. She said she turned to look south and "found the sky filthy gray with a sun the size of forever and the color of faded blood." They began to grab things to take (including two upset cats). She said it was interesting what they took: mostly things that carried memories, not necessarily the most valuable. They went to a friend's house about 15 miles north of Louisville where they hunkered down until they could go back.

Both the Lewises and the McKees voiced the same question during this ordeal: Do we still have a home? Luckily, the answer for them was "yes."

Chuck Scherk sent me an article from the June 2021 issue of Preservation & Progress - The Quarterly Publication of the Gettysburg Foundation in which **Cliff Bream** (9th Company) and his wife, Julie, are prominently mentioned as a result of their involvement in the rehabilitation of the very significant Culp's Hill portion of the Gettysburg Battlefield. Through the years, Culp's Hill has become overgrown to the extent that it is virtually impossible to visualize the action that occurred there. The effort by the Gettysburg Foundation in partnership with the Gettysburg National Military Park aims to restore the appearance of Culp's Hill to be much more representative to what it would have been in 1863 by thinning the woodlot, removing overgrown vegetation and highlighting remnant breastworks. They'll also add interpretive

NEW JERSEY (BB-62). He attended the Naval Postgraduate School, graduating with a master's degree in Computer Science. He completed the prototype program and assisted in the development of the Systems Acquisition Management curriculum.

Richard served on the staff of the Chief of Naval Operations as Combat Systems Division Head and on the Joint Staff as the J-63 responsible for all systems integration in the National Military Command Center. His personal awards include the Defense Superior Service Medal and three awards of the Legion of Merit, as well as other meritorious and combat service and campaign awards.

Upon retiring from the Navy in 1993, he joined General Dynamics becoming the vice president of homeland security at the successor company, BAE Systems. Additionally, he served as that company's chief cartographer and chief hydrographer.

Always the sailors, Richard and his wife, Karen, cruised their sailboat, CHESSIE, extensively from the Gulf of Alaska to Central America for five years. In his retirement, he dedicated his life to a variety of volunteer activities in the Gig Harbor, WA, area including mentoring/tutoring at the local high school, serving as a docent in TURNER JOY (DD-951), and teaching history at Tacoma Community College.

Richard is survived by his wife of 30 years, Karen; their four children, Richard, Danielle, Peter and Adam; and eight grandchildren, Jordan, Elle, Gracie, Zoe, Thea, Sam, Harrison and Drummond.

Richard always said his close family relationships and his Naval Academy classmates represented the best part of his life. He will be greatly missed.

ARNE PAUL SODERMAN '65

Captain Arne P. Soderman, USN (Ret.), passed away from COVID-19 pneumonia on 21 December 2021, with his family by his side. He had been successfully fighting chronic lymphocytic leukemia, but the infection overpowered his weakened immune system.

Arne was born on 11 February 1943 in Springfield Gardens, Queens County, NY, the son of Arne Johannes Soderman and Helen (Bendi) Soderman.

He spent his early youth in Yonkers, NY, moving later to Hastings-on-Hudson. Upon graduating from Wappingers Central High School in 1961, he received an appointment to the Naval Academy.

Newly commissioned, Arne reported to HARRY E. HUBBARD (DD-748), which deployed to WestPac and Vietnam. It was during this tour that Arne got the desire to fly and in May of 1968, he received orders to start basic naval air training in the T-34, carrier training in the T-28 and advanced training in VT-21 (Kingsville, TX). He proudly received his Wings of Gold in May of 1969, which resulted in further training in the A-4F. He joined VA-164 aboard Hancock (CV-19) carrying out combat missions in the Gulf of Tonkin and North and South Vietnam. Arne was awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross for missions well done during this challenging assignment.


Subsequent assignments included admiral's aide in Yokosuka, Japan, and the Naval Postgraduate School, earning a master's degree in Aeronautical Engineering. In 1976, he transitioned to the A-7E and joined VA-93 aboard MIDWAY (CVA-41), until 1979 when he tested overhauled A-4s at the Naval Rework Facility (NARF) in Pensacola, FL.

In 1981, Arne left active duty and joined Southwest Airlines, where he enjoyed 23 years of flying. He flew B737s. His nickname at Southwest was "32" because when he laughed, you could see all 32 of his teeth! During flights, he would quiz passengers on historical landmarks they were passing. Passenger answers were written on napkins and flight attendants collected them.

Retirement was spent cruising. Riverboats were his first love. No matter what boat or what country, everyone was singing Neil Diamond's "Sweet Caroline" by the time he left! Those who knew Arne will forever miss his contagious laugh and bright smile, his scientific curiosity and his kindness, which he shared generously with all.

Arne leaves behind his wife, Pat; daughter, Lillian; son, Arne Johnston; and grandson, Gus. He is also survived by his brother, Jon, of New Brunswick, Canada.

Burial will take place at Arlington National Cemetery at a later date. *
